

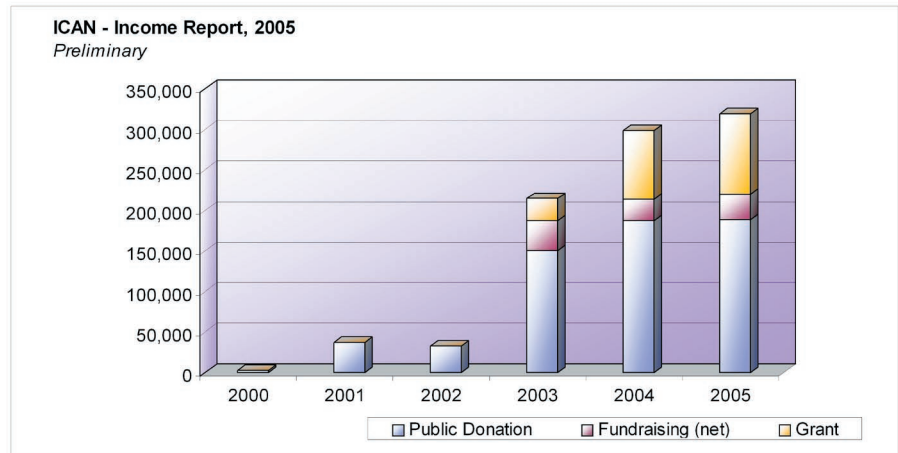

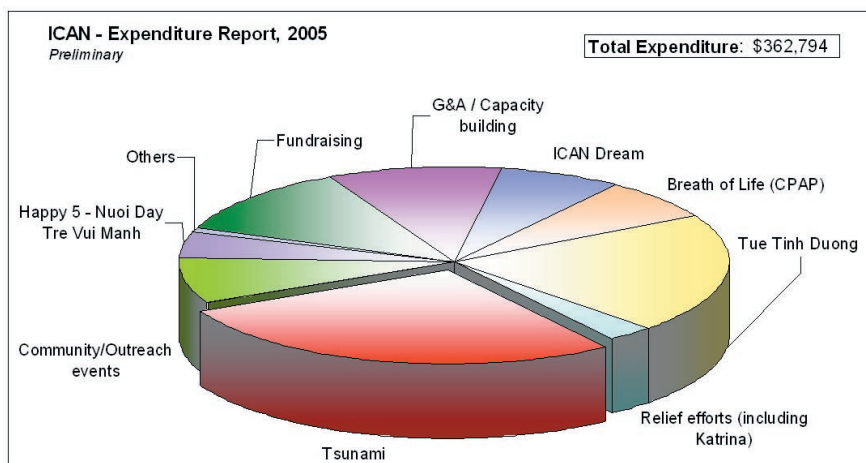
Total receipts in 2005 totaled approximately \$315,000 with \$189,000 in public donation, \$100,000 in grants and contracts, and \$30,000 from fundraising activities, mainly the annual Hát Cho Tuổi Thơ concert (net of expenses). Of the \$189,000 in public donation, close to \$100,000 was designated to help tsunami victims in South Asia and Hurricane Katrina victims in New Orleans and nearby areas.



Progress was also made in raising funds from other sources. Thanks to our donors who have leveraged the support of their companies, ICAN also received \$8,000 in Corporate Matching from companies such as SUN, Countrywide, Tyco, Lyondell, and Microsoft. ICAN was also listed in Santa Clara County's Combined Giving Campaign and received 13 individual checks (totaling \$376) from County's employees. Some other donors have donated to ICAN via United Way and the County by having contribution deducted from their paychecks on a regular basis.. ICAN also received \$6,000 from a private fundraising dinner organized by a group of devoted donors. In addition, ICAN recently launched the SCRIP program, a way to donate money back to ICAN while still maintaining your lifestyle (for more information on this project, please see SCRIP program page).
